Spiritual Growth

I will...

- Seek to grow in prayer time and worship habits
- Unite with a Bible study class and attend on a regular basis,
- Spend time in God's word regularly
- Attend worship gatherings weekly even when my team is not scheduled
- Engage faithfully in presenting the tithe as part of my own personal expression of worship

Team Unity

I will,

- Be supportive of the Northbrook staff and the direction and pursuits of the body
- Seek to be an encourager of other music ministry participants
- Be willing to pray for those involved in music and worship ministries
- Maintain a good reputation inside and outside the church. Make every effort to conduct myself in a manner that honors God, affording nothing in my moral conduct that could damage my own personal witness or that could cause another person to stumble
- Be willing to step aside if a specific behavior may damage my ability to effectively serve in the Northbrook music ministry.

Rehearsals

I will...

- Prioritize worship team rehearsals so that participation at rehearsals is consistent.
- Make every effort to come to rehearsals having listened to available music posted on the group site or available cds.
- Make sure to notify Chuck about upcoming absences and who will be your substitute

Sunday mornings

I will...

- Not cancel my scheduled rotation without 48hrs notice except in the case of an emergency
- Seek to learn to smile and improve my stage presence.
- Be mindful of the feelings of others when it comes to courtesy. This includes being respectful of other peoples time by being on time for sound checks.

Clothing

Things to think about.....

Remember that we are here to glorify our Lord. The objective in worship is to draw attention to our Savior, not to ourselves. Please be selective when choosing what to wear. The things we chose to wear can add to or diminish that message. A Christian in immodest attire is sending a message that misleads, defrauds and potentially causes a weaker brother or sister to stumble. Clothes that are considered conservative in the world's eyes might not be appropriate for leading in worship. Everyone wants to be fashionable but never in a way that distracts or draws attention to ones self. Pray and examine what you are wearing and why.

I Will.....

- Wear loose fitting slacks or skirts that come to the bottom of the knee cap. (Because of the height of stage in relation to the audience)
- Be mindful to always wear necessary undergarments. Remember that a slip is usually necessary because of intense light on stage.
- Make sure that all blouses and tops are wide enough to have a modest appearance and do not allow undergarments to be visible. Tops and blouses should be long enough to be tucked in.

Ladies

I will avoid:

- Low-rise pants, slacks, or skirts that are tight and form fitting
- Stiletto heeled shoes (for safety getting on and off stage and risers)
- Skirts with front or side slits
- Any clothing that is form fitting or tight
- Tank tops, spaghetti straps, backless or strapless dresses, or blouses during worship services.
- Sheer dresses or blouses that are not layered appropriately (Remember the bright lighting)
- Visible cleavage and/or midriff
- Use of perfume or cologne
- Jeans on Sunday mornings (they are fine on Wed. evening)

Men

I will avoid (Men)

- Jeans on Sunday morning (they are fine on Wed. evening)
- Slacks or shirts that are overly tight and form-fitting
- Cologne or fragrance of any kind
